

NOTIFIABLE MEDICAL CONDITIONS (NMC) CASE DEFINITIONS

Category 1: Immediate reporting telephonically followed by written or electronic notification within 24hrs of diagnosing a case

CORONAVIRUS DISEASE-2019 (COVID-19)

Why is surveillance necessary?	Who must notify and when?	Suspected case definition	Probable case definition	Confirmed case definition
On the 31st December 2019, the World Health Organization (WHO) China country office reported a cluster of pneumonia cases in Wuhan City, Hubei Province of China now known to be caused by a novel virus.	The healthcare worker responsible for the patient should notify authorities immediately of a probable or confirmed case.	Not notifiable	Persons with acute respiratory illness with sudden onset of at least one of the following: cough, sore throat, shortness of breath or fever [≥ 38°C (measured) or history of fever (subjective)] irrespective of admission status	A person with laboratory confirmation of SARS-CoV-2 infection (using a PCR-based assay), irrespective of clinical signs and symptoms.
Severe acute respiratory syndrome coronavirus 2 (SARS-CoV-2) has been confirmed as the causative virus of coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19). Cases have now been identified in over 100 countries including South Africa and WHO has declared a global pandemic.	Outcome of patient should be updated if status changes following notification.		for whom testing for SARS-CoV-2 is inconclusive (the result of the test reported by the laboratory) or who tested positive on a pan-coronavirus assay	

Additional notes

COVID-19 person under investigation (PUI) case definition: Persons with acute respiratory illness with sudden onset of at least one of the following: cough, sore throat, shortness of breath or fever [\geq 38°C (measured) or history of fever (subjective)] irrespective of admission status.

Persons at a highest risk are those who have an acute respiratory illness and who, in the 14 days prior to onset of symptoms, met at least one of the following epidemiological criteria:

- (i) Were in close contact with a confirmed or probable case of SARS-CoV-2 infection; OR
- (ii) Had a history of travel to areas with local transmission of SARS-CoV-2; OR
- (iii) Worked in, or attended a health care facility where patients with SARS-CoV-2 infections were being treated; OR
- (iv) Admitted with severe pneumonia of unknown aetiology.
