## 2. TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF REQUEST FOR QUOTATION (RFQ)

- a) This document may contain confidential information that is the property of the NHLS and the Client.
- b) No part of the contents may be used, copied, disclosed or conveyed in whole or in part to any party in any manner whatsoever other than for preparing a proposal in response to this RFQ, without prior written permission from NHLS and the Client.
- c) All Copyright and Intellectual Property herein vests with NHLS and its Client.
- d) Late and incomplete submissions will not be accepted.
- e) SDB 7 (form of offer) must be completed, and should the total RFQ prices differ, the one indicated on the form of offer shall be considered the correct price.
- f) Any bidder who has reasons to believe that the RFQ specification is based on a specific brand must inform NHLS before RFQ closing date
- g) A compulsory clarification site meeting or briefing session will be conducted at: **NHLS Main Reception (Outside) on Tuesday the 23<sup>rd</sup> of July 2025, Time 10:00 am.**

The tenderer shall inspect and examine the Site and its surroundings and shall satisfy himself/herself before submitting his/her quotation. The bidder must be represented at the site inspection by a person who is suitably qualified and experiences to comprehend the implications of the work involved.

  - The contractor will be responsible for final measurements.
- h) Writing must be in block letters and black ink.
- i) Quotation procedure using the two (2) stage system will apply: **Not applicable.**
- j) Respondents arriving after the allocated time of the briefing session and failing to attend the compulsory RFQ/Site briefing will be disqualified
- k) No services must be rendered or goods delivered before an official NHLS Purchase Order form has been received.
- l) This RFQ will be evaluated in terms of the 80/20 preference point system prescribed by the Preferential Procurement Regulations, 2022.
- m) All questions regarding this RFQ must be forwarded to the [procurementcorporate@nhls.ac.za](mailto:procurementcorporate@nhls.ac.za) 24 hours prior the RFQ closing date.
- n) The General Conditions of Contract (GCC) issued by National Treasury are applicable.
- o) In case of bids where Consortia / Joint Ventures, Consortia/Joint Venture agreement signed by both parties must be submitted with bid proposal. Each JV partner must submit all their mandatory documentation.

### **Quotation must be All-Inclusive**

- i. The Supplier shall allow in the quotation for all deliverables as stipulated in the scope, labour, material, consumables, accessories, software, supervision, overhead costs, profit, royalties, all taxes, levies, duties, variations in exchange rates (if applicable), disbursements and everything necessary for the execution and completion of the works in accordance with the quotation documents.
- ii. Value Added Tax (VAT) shall be excluded from the rates and prices and provided for as the total VAT on the cost of the Works in the Summary of Schedule of Rates and Prices.  
The Supplier rates and prices shall be fixed for the duration of the contract and not subject to adjustment except as provided for in the conditions of contract.
- iii. The offer must be in ZAR currency.
- iv. The NHLS reserve the right to do due diligence on the quotations and to benchmark prices quoted.
- v. Quotes should be submitted on an official letterhead and duly signed.

### **Delays in the supplier's performance**

- i. Delivery of the goods and performance of services shall be made by the supplier in accordance with the time schedule prescribed by the purchaser in the contract.
- ii. If at any time during performance of the contract, the supplier or its subcontractor(s) should encounter

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conditions impeding timely delivery of the goods and performance of services, the supplier shall promptly notify the purchaser in writing of the fact of the delay, its likely duration, and its cause(s). As soon as practicable after receipt of the supplier's notice, the purchaser shall evaluate the situation and may at his discretion extend the supplier's time for performance, with or without the imposition of penalties, in which case the extension shall be ratified by the parties by amendment of contract.

- iii. The right is reserved to procure outside of the contract small quantities or to have minor essential services executed if an emergency arises, the supplier's point of supply is not situated at or near the place where the supplies are required, or the supplier's services are not readily available.
- iv. Except as provided under GCC Clause 25, a delay by the supplier in the performance of its delivery obligations shall render the supplier liable to the imposition of penalties, pursuant to GCC Clause 22, unless an extension of time is agreed upon pursuant to GCC Clause 22.2 without the application of penalties.
- v. Upon any delay beyond the delivery period in the case of a supplies contract, the purchaser shall, without cancelling the contract, be entitled to purchase supplies of a similar Functionality and up to the same quantity in substitution of the goods not supplied in conformity with the contract and to return any goods delivered later at the supplier's expense and risk, or to cancel the contract and buy such goods as may be required to complete the contract and without prejudice to his other rights, be entitled to claim damages from the supplier.

**Penalties**

- i. Subject to GCC Clause 25, if the supplier fails to deliver any or all of the goods or to perform the services within the period(s) specified in the contract, the purchaser shall, without prejudice to its other remedies under the contract, deduct from the contract price, as a penalty, a sum calculated on the delivered price of the delayed goods or unperformed services using the current prime interest rate calculated for each day of the delay until actual delivery or performance. The purchaser may also consider termination of the contract pursuant to GCC Clause 23.

### 3. SCOPE OF WORKS

The appointed contractor shall undertake to provide NHLS with services of a high and acceptable standard, which shall include but are not limited to:

- Supply and installation of biometric equipment at NHLS offices.

#### Deliverables

The installed biometric system should provide but is not limited to:

- Access cards.
- Secured relay units.

- Access control functionality to all entrances but with the capability of scaled up or restricted access to IT, HR, Grants, CFO and the CEO.
- Disability control measures – alternative methods to authenticate employees with disabilities.
- Must use an algorithm able to enroll and encode fingerprint template.
- Period updates to latest version of system.
- User acceptance test for each office.
- Project sign-off certificate.

### **Compatibility**

- The contractor shall ensure that biometric system hardware and software are installed and activated by only suitably qualified employees, contractors or subcontractors in possession of the required qualifications at the level determined by the State Security Agency of South Africa.
- The biometric system should be able to be integrated with existing NHLS IT infrastructure namely:
  1. Microsoft Windows Suite - the latest version.
  2. Be comparable IMPRO IXP400 /PORTAL
  3. Be accessible via LAN. 3

### **Specification**

General System Functionality Requirements.

#### **1 Clock-Ins**

- Each office should be able to serve as its own clocking station.
- Each entry of the clock-in station operation to be 1: n (1 is to many relationship) identification mode.
- Fingerprint identification mode to be scalable.
- Have facility to download clock-in information LAN/VPN (WPN).
- Clock-in station to store minimum 500 fingerprint records.

#### **2 Enrolment**

The system must allow the following information to be captured when employees are enrolled:

- Employee name.
- Employee payroll number.
- Employee Regional Office.
- Employee Local Office/Department.
- Employee Satellite Office.
- Two (02) fingers.
- Keypad mode/or and proximity card mode optional for convenience for physically impaired people.
- Employee address and contact information.
- Photo of employee.
- The system must have an auto synchronisation function enabling two-way flow of information between offices



and Head Office (main office) allowing employees to scan at all times.

### **3 Reporting**

The software must be capable of providing Management with a series of reports on real-time and historical reports.

- System reports to be able to identify duplicate clock-in/out.
- System report for employees that share credentials attendance – system to be able to extract real-time attendance log of all employees at any given time.
- Absentees – system to be able to extract real-time log of all employees who did not clocking at any given time.
- Late comers – system to identify who arrived late and what time they arrived.
- System must be able to produce both summary report and detailed report per Local Office, regionally and nationally when required.
- System to have web-reporting portal that will be available at National Office, Provincial Office and Local Offices.
- Fingerprints to be stored in an encrypted format and system must not allow reproduction of same.

### **4 Hardware – Fingerprint Reader**

- Fingerprint reader to operate in an indoor and outdoor environment and must be built for rugged and inclement weather conditions.
- Reader should use a high-end optical lens cable of extracting 80+ minutiae points.
- Reader should operate on a multi system-fingerprint mode and card mode.
- The reader must be 500 dpi or higher scanner.
- Reader must be able to read worn or damaged fingerprints.
- Reader to allow at least Two (02) finger scanning.
- Reader to have on-board memory capable of storing 1: n numbers of fingerprints/user per office category.
- Reader to be able to show visual confirmation on successful fingerprint scanning.
- Security of system to be guaranteed.

## 6. RFQ EVALUATION PROCESS AND CRITERIA

The RFQ will be evaluated by the Cross Functional Evaluation Team (CFET) and the successful service provider will be selected based on a four-phased approach (4-Stages):

### **Stage 1: Administrative Compliance**

All incomplete submissions and respondents who do not meet the compliance requirements at quotation submission will be eliminated from further evaluation.

### **Stage 2: Mandatory technical requirements**

All incomplete submissions and respondents who do not meet the minimum technical mandatory requirements at quotation submission will be eliminated from further evaluation.

### **Stage 3: Functionality (Technical) Evaluation Criteria**

The RFQ will be evaluated by the Cross Functional Evaluation Team (CFET) and the successful service provider will be selected based on meeting minimum threshold criteria of **75%**.

### **Stage 4: Price and specific goals**

The final evaluation phase will be based on Price and Specific Goals.

Determination of Percentage for Price – 80 percentage, & Determination of level for Specific Goals – 20 percentage.

### **Stage 1: Administrative Compliance**
