- e) SDB 7 (form of offer) must be completed, and should the total RFQ prices differ, the one indicated on the form offer shall be considered the correct price.
- f) Any bidder who has reasons to believe that the RFQ specification is based on a specific brand must inform NHI before RFQ closing date

Delays in the supplier's performance

If at any time during performance of the contract, the supplier or its subcontractor(s) should encount conditions impeding timely delivery of the goods and performance of services, the supplier shall promptly not the purchaser in writing of the fact of the delay, its likely duration, and its cause(s). As soon as practicable af receipt of the supplier's notice, the purchaser shall evaluate the situation and may at his discretion extend t supplier's time for performance, with or without the imposition of penalties, in which case the extension she to be ratified by the parties by amendment of contract.
- . The right is reserved PROVISION outside of the contract small quantities or to have minor essential servic executed if an emergency arises, the supplier's point of supply is not situated at or near the place where t supplies are required, or the supplier's services are not readily available.
